## THE ADVENT WREATH



On Monday, November 15<sup>th</sup>, forty days prior to the celebration of the Feast of our Lord's Nativity, the Holy Orthodox Church began the Christmas Fast. This period of six weeks is often called *Advent*, which means *the Coming*, and refers to the Coming of the Lord and Savior Jesus Christ in the Mystery of His Holy Nativity.

Christmas and Epiphany are Feasts of Light, celebrating the Coming and Manifestation of Christ, the Light of the world. Nature itself helps us to experience these Feasts of Light. With the coming of the winter the days get shorter and the nights longer, but once we reach Christmas Day itself the reverse begins to happen. Nature prepares for the Coming of Christ, the Light in the darkness – and so do we during the Holy Season of Advent.

To help in our preparation, we have an Advent Wreath in Church. The Wreath, made of evergreens, has six candles on it – one for each week in Advent. **Today, Sunday, December 12, we light the 5**<sup>th</sup> **Candle on the Advent Wreath** along with special prayers, as we prepare ourselves to receive Christ the Light of the world into our hearts with faith, hope, love, joy, peace and kindness.

# ADVENT MEDITATION PERSONS ARE GIFTS

**PERSONS ARE GIFTS...**At least Jesus thought so. He said "Father, I want those You have given Me to be where I am" (John 17:24)

I agree with Him. "I also want those whom the Father has given me, to be where I am.

### Persons are gifts which the Father sends me wrapped.

...some are wrapped beautifully; they attract me immediately

...some come in very ordinary wrapping paper.

... some have been mishandled in the mail.

...once in a while there is a "special delivery."

... some are gifts which come very loosely wrapped

...some are gifts that come very tightly wrapped.

### But the wrapping is not the gift.

...it is so easy to make this mistake

...some are very easy to open up

...with others I need help.

...is this because they are afraid?

...does it hurt to be opened?

...have they been opened before, and thrown away?

... could it be that this gift is not for me?

### I am a person, so I am a gift too.

...a gift to myself, first of all. Father gave me myself.

...what do I think of me?

...have I ever really looked inside the wrappings?

...am I afraid to?

...maybe I have never seen the wonderful gift I am.

Can the Father's gifts be anything but beautiful?
...I love the gifts which those I love give me.
Why not love this gift of myself?

### Am I a gift to other persons?

...Am I willing to be given to others?
...do others have to be content with the wrappings only?
...are others permitted to know me as I really am?
...can others enjoy the gift of me?

### Every meeting of persons is an exchange of gifts.

...a friend is a gift – not just for me – but to others through me ...I destroy the "giftness" when I try to possess and am jealous ...If I try to save that life for me alone, I lose it. ...If I share it with others, I save it.

Persons are gifts ... gifts received and gifts given!

### **PANDEMIC GUIDELINES**

Since the beginning of the <u>Covid-19 Pandemic</u> we have been taking every PRECAUTION to protect the health and well-bring of all our people. In accordance with the CDC, the State of Ohio, and our Diocesan Directives, St. Elia Parish will follow these directives:

- 1) If you are sick and/or exhibit coronavirus symptoms, you must refrain from attending services.
- 2) While the CDC and the State of Ohio have lifted the mask mandate, the social distancing and capacity restrictions, the State officials recommend that <u>unvaccinated people</u> continue to wear the masks indoors. The Diocesan Directives stress that everyone is welcome to continue wearing face coverings if there is any level of discomfort.
- 3) The kissing of Icons, the Cross, the Gospel Book, the Chalice and the priest's hand when receiving the blessing is permitted if you are comfortable doing so
- 4)The sanitizer and masks are available in the vestibule for your convenience
