

PRAYERS FOR THE UNBORN



Matthew 2:16-18

"Then Herod, when he saw that he was deceived by the wise men, was exceedingly angry; and he sent forth and put to death all the male children who were in Bethlehem and in all its districts, from two years old and under, according to the time which he had determined from the wise men. Then was fulfilled what was spoken by Jeremiah the prophet, saying:

'A voice was heard in Ramah, Lamentation, weeping, and great mourning, Rachel weeping for her children, Refusing to be comforted, Because they are no more.'"

In his prophecy Jeremiah pictures Rachel, wife of Jacob, who had long been dead, weeping even in her tomb, for the fate that had befallen her people, her children, who were being led away into exile. Now, the mothers of Bethlehem weep for the slaughter of their children, the Holy Innocents. As Rachel was told Continued on next page

her children would return from exile in Babylon, so Jesus will return from His exile in Egypt. This Carpatho-Russian Carol sings of the Holy Innocents: Do not weep, O Rachel.
See your children they are whole,
They did not die, they are alive, they are in heaven.
In their new sanctuary, they are incorruptible.
For God the Son they were condemned.
They were doomed to death
For the sins of Herod innocents were slaughtered.
Rachel is weeping, her children are sleeping.
Though they were mortals, their souls are immortal.
For the loss of their lives, they were crowned as martyrs.

The children aborted in our time are the Holy Innocents of our day and age.

Fr.
