THE ADVENT WREATH

On Tuesday, November 15, forty days prior to the celebration of the Feast of Christmas, the Holy Orthodox Church begins the Christmas Fast. This period of six weeks is often called *Advent* which means *The Coming* and refers to the Coming of our lord and Savior Jesus Christ in the Mystery of His Holy Nativity.

The Feast of the Nativity of our Lord together with Feast of His Baptism in the Jordan are Feasts of Light celebrating the coming and manifestation of Christ the Light of the world. Nature itself helps us to experience these Feasts of Light. With the coming of winter, the days get shorter and the nights longer, but once we reach Christmas itself the reverse begins to happen. Nature prepares for the Coming of Christ, the Light in the darkness and so do we during the Holy Season of Advent.

To help in our preparation, we will have an Advent Wreath in Church. The Wreath, made of evergreens, will have six candles on it. This Sunday, November 13, we will light the first candle on the wreath along with our Advent Prayers

Prepare O Bethlehem, for Eden has been opened to all! Adorn yourself O Ephrathah, for the tree of life blossoms forth from the Virgin in the cave! Her womb is a spiritual paradise planted with the Divine Fruit: For if we eat of it, we shall live forever and not die like Adam. Christ comes to restore the image which He made in the beginning.

SUNDAY SCRIPTURE READINGS

Epistle: Galatians 2:16-20

Knowing that a man is not justified by the works of the law, but by the faith of Jesus Christ, even we have believed in Jesus Christ, that we might be justified by the faith of Christ, and not by the works of the law: for by the works of the law shall no flesh be justified.

But if, while we seek to be justified by Christ, we ourselves also are found sinners, is therefore Christ the minister of sin? God forbid.

For if I build again the things which I destroyed, I make myself a transgressor.

For I through the law am dead to the law, that I might live unto God.

I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ lives in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave himself for me.

Gospel: Luke 8:41-56

And behold, there came a man named Jairus, and he was a ruler of the synagogue. And he fell down at Jesus' feet and begged Him to come to his house, for he had an only daughter about twelve years of age, and she was dying.

But as He went, the multitudes thronged Him. Now a woman, having a flow of blood for twelve years, who had spent all her livelihood on physicians and could not be healed by any, came from behind and touched the border of His garment. And immediately her flow of blood stopped.

And Jesus said, "Who touched Me?"

When all denied it, Peter ⁶ and those with him said, "Master, the multitudes throng and press You, ⁷ and You say, 'Who touched Me?'"

But Jesus said,

"Somebody touched Me, for I perceived "power going out from Me."

Now when the woman saw that she was not hidden, she came trembling; and falling down before Him, she declared to Him inthe presence of all the people the reason she had touched Him and how she was healed immediately.

And He said to her.

"Daughter, ⁸be of good cheer; ^oyour faith has made you well. Go in peace."

Jairus's Daughter is Raised

While He was still speaking, someone came from the ruler of the synagogue's *house*, saying to him, "Your daughter is dead. Do not trouble the ⁹Teacher."

But when Jesus heard *it*, He answered him,

saying, "Do not be afraid; ^ronly believe, and she will be made well."

When He came into the house, He permitted no one to go $\frac{1}{1}$ in except Peter, James, and John, and the father and mother of the girl.

Now all wept and mourned for her;

but He said, Do not weep; she is not dead, but sleeping."

And they ridiculed Him, knowing that she was dead. But He ³put them all outside, took her by the hand and called, saying, "Little girl, arise." Then her spirit returned, and she arose immediately. And He commanded that she be given something to eat. And her parents were astonished, but He charged them to tell no one what had happened.


