Epistle: 2 Corinthians 9:6-11

The Cheerful Giver

⁶ But this *I say:* He who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and he who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. ⁷ *So let* each one *give* as he purposes in his heart, not grudgingly or of necessity; for God loves a cheerful giver.

⁸ And God *is* able to make all grace abound toward you, that you, always having all sufficiency in all *things*, may have an abundance for every good work. ⁹ As it is written:

"He has dispersed abroad, He has given to the poor; His righteousness endures forever."

¹⁰ Now may He who supplies seed to the sower, and bread for food, supply and multiply the seed you have *sown* and increase the fruits of your righteousness, ¹¹ while *you are* enriched in everything for all liberality, which causes thanksgiving through us to God.

Gospel: John 17:1-13

Jesus Prays for Himself

17 Jesus spoke these words, lifted up His eyes to heaven, and said: "Father, the hour has come. Glorify Your Son, that Your Son also may glorify You, ² as You have given Him authority over all flesh, that He ^[a]should give eternal life to as many as You have given Him. ³ And this is eternal life, that they may know You, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom You have sent. ⁴ I have glorified You on the earth. I have finished the work which You have given Me to do. ⁵ And now, O Father, glorify Me together ^[b]with Yourself, with the glory which I had with You before the world was.

Jesus Prays for His Disciples

⁶ "I have ^[c]manifested Your name to the men whom You have given Me out of the world. They were Yours, You gave them to Me, and they have kept Your word. ⁷ Now they have known that all things which You have given Me are from You. ⁸ For I have given

to them the words which You have given Me; and they have received *them*, and have known surely that I came forth from You; and they have believed that You sent Me.

9 "I pray for them. I do not pray for the world but for those whom You have given Me, for they are Yours. ¹⁰ And all Mine are Yours, and Yours are Mine, and I am glorified in them. ¹¹ Now I am no longer in the world, but these are in the world, and I come to You. Holy Father, keep^[d] through Your name those whom You have given Me, that they may be one as We *are*. ¹² While I was with them ^[e] in the world, I kept them in ^[f] Your name. Those whom You gave Me I have kept; and none of them is ^[g] lost except the son of ^[h] perdition, that the Scripture might be fulfilled. ¹³ But now I come to You, and these things I speak in the world, that they may have My joy fulfilled in themselves.

Commemoration of the Holy Fathers of the Seventh Ecumenical Council

Commemorated on October 8

Today the Church remembers the 350 holy Fathers of the Seventh Ecumenical Council under the holy Patriarch Tarasius (February 25).

The Synod of 787, the second to meet at Nicea, refuted the Iconoclast heresy during the reign of Empress Irene and her son Constantine VI.

The Council decreed that the veneration of icons was not idolatry (Exodus 20:4-5), because the honor shown to them is not directed to the wood or paint, but passes to the prototype (the person depicted).

It also upheld the possibility of depicting Christ, Who became man and took flesh at His Incarnation.

The Father, on the other hand, cannot be represented in His eternal nature, because "no man has seen God at any time" (John 1:18).

The Conference Business Session will commence at 2:00 pm. St. Elia's Delegates are Fr. Don and Veronica Bilas. Vespers will be served at 5:00 pm and the Banquet at 7:00 pm. On Sunday morning the Divine Liturgy will be concelebrated at 10:00 am by His Beatitude Tikhon, Archbishop Alexander, and Diocesan Clergy.

Protodeacon James Gresh will be serving Vespers on Saturday, October 7th at 5:00 pm and the Typica Service at St. Elia at 9:30 am on Sunday, October 8th.
