THE ADVENT WREATH

The Feast of the Nativity of our Lord together with Feast of His Baptism in the Jordan are Feasts of Light celebrating the coming and manifestation of Christ the Light of the world. Nature itself helps us to experience these Feasts of Light.

With the coming of winter, the days get shorter and the nights longer, but once we reach Christmas itself the reverse begins to happen. Nature prepares for the Coming of Christ, the Light in the darkness and so do we during the Holy Season of Advent.

To help in our preparation, we will have an Advent Wreath in Church. The Wreath, made of evergreens, will have six candles on it: one for each Sunday in Advent. After the homily, the children will come up to light the candles on the wreath each Sunday.

Beginning today, Sunday, November 19, we will light the first candle on the wreath along with our Advent Prayers:

Prepare O Bethlehem, for Eden has been opened to all! Adorn yourself O Ephrathah, for the tree of life blossoms forth from the Virgin in the cave! Her womb is a spiritual paradise planted with the Divine Fruit: For if we eat of it, we shall live forever and not die like Adam. Christ comes to restore the image which He made in the beginning.

GOD'S PLAN

November 20

Forefeast of the Entrance of the Theotokos into the Temple

The blessed and ever-Virgin Mary spring from the royal stock and family of David. Her father's name was Joachim and her mother's name was Anna. Their lives were plain and righteous before the Lord and irreproachable and pious before men.

Being childless, they were spurned by the Jewish people who consider it a curse from God and their gifts were rejected by the priest in the Temple. They continually offered prayers that God would bless them with a child.

An angel appeared to Joachim and then to Anna telling them that their prayers have been heard. When Anna heard she would conceive a child she said:

"As the Lord my God lives, if I beget either male or female, I will bring it as a gift to the Lord my God and it shall minister unto Him all the days of its life."

When all hope was gone, Joachim and Anna gave birth to the pure Virgin, and, in piety, they promised to offer her to God. Today they fulfill their promise, giving their child as a sacrifice in the house of God.

Troparion of the Forefeast

Today Anna bequeaths joy to all instead of sorrow, by bringing forth her fruit, the only ever-Virgin. In fulfillment of her vow; today with joy she brings to the temple of the Lord, the true temple and pure Mother of God the Word.

FEAST OF THE ENTRANCE OF THE THEOTOKOS INTO THE TEMPLE

November 21

Seven days within the time of Advent, on November 21st, the Feast of Mary's Entrance into the Temple as a child is celebrated. This Feast is filled with import spiritual significance for us, the believers.


The texts of the Services tell how Mary was brought by her parents as a small child to the Temple to be raised there, consecrated to the service of the Lord, until the time of her betrothal in marriage.

According to Church tradition, Mary was solemnly received by the temple community, which was headed by the priest Zacharias, the father of John the Baptist. She was led to the holy place to prepare herself to become the "holy of holies" of God, the living sanctuary and temple of the Divine Child Who was to be born of her.

The main theme of Mary's Entrance into the Temple is the fact that she enters the Temple to become herself the LIVING TEMPLE OF GOD, thus inaugurating the New Testament in which are fulfilled the prophecies of the Old Testament that "THE DWELLING PLACE OF GOD IS WITH MAN."

"Rejoice, O Fulfillment of the Creator's dispensation! "

Father Alexander Schmemann celebrated his last Divine Liturgy on Thanksgiving Day, Nov. 24, 1983. At the end of the Liturgy, he called upon all of us to give thanks to God:

"Everyone capable of thanksgiving is capable of salvation and eternal joy.

Thank you, O Lord, for having accepted this Eucharist, which is offered to the Holy Trinity, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and which filled our hearts with the joy, peace and righteousness in the Holy Spirit.

Thank you, O Lord, for having revealed Yourself unto us and for giving us the foretaste of Your Kingdom.

Thank you, O Lord, for having united us to one another, in serving You and Your Holy Church.

Thank you, O Lord, for having helped us to overcome all difficulties, tensions, passions, and temptations and for having restored peace, mutual love and joy in sharing the communion of the Holy Spirit.

Thank You, O Lord, for having given us this country where we are free to worship.

Thank you, O Lord, for this school, where the name of God is proclaimed.

Thank you, O Lord for our families, husbands, wives and, especially, children, who teach us how to celebrate Your holy Name, in joy, movement and holy noise.

Thank you, O Lord, for everyone and everything. Great are you, O Lord, and marvelous are Your deeds, and no word is sufficient to celebrate Your miracles. Lord, it is good to be here! Amen."
