GOD'S BLESSED ASSURANCE

"My love shall never leave you, nor my covenant of peace be shaken, says the Lord, who has mercy on you." (Isaid 54:10b)

We need blessed assurance, an anchor that provides stability in a turbulent and changing world. Isaiah the prophet provides and answer: God's love will never leave us nor can the great covenant of peace be shaken. This blessed assurance of love and peace flows out of God's immense mercy.

Jesus is the fulfillment of what Isaiah the prophet was talking about. Jesus is our peace; Jesus is the manifestation of God's love and mercy.

Our Advent task is to open our minds and hearts to Christ coming into our lives today. Once we have said yes to the divine invitation, then we are challenged to transmit the divine love, mercy, and peace to others. It's all about building the kingdom.

Isaiah speaks of God's love as enduring. God's endurance and fidelity is infinite. This should give us consolation as we struggle to avoid sin and live a life of grace.

"From my youth many passions have fought against me, but do Thou help me, O my Savior...Every soul is enlivened by the Holy Spirit and is exalted in purity, illumined by the Holy Trinity in a sacred mystery."

THE ADVENT WREATH

The Feast of the Nativity of our Lord together with Feast of His Baptism in the Jordan are Feasts of Light celebrating the coming and manifestation of Christ the Light of the world. Nature itself helps us to experience these Feasts of Light.

With the coming of winter, the days get shorter and the nights longer, but once we reach Christmas itself the reverse begins to happen. Nature prepares for the Coming of Christ, the Light in the darkness and so do we during the Holy Season of Advent.

To help in our preparation, we have an Advent Wreath in Church. The Wreath, made of evergreens, will have six candles on it: one for each Sunday in Advent. After the homily, the children will come up to light the candles on the wreath each Sunday.

Today, Sunday, December 10, we will light the fourth candle on the wreath along with our Advent Prayers:

Prepare O Bethlehem, for Eden has been opened to all! Adorn yourself O Ephrathah, for the tree of life blossoms forth from the Virgin in the cave! Her womb is a spiritual paradise planted with the Divine Fruit: For if we eat of it, we shall live forever and not die like Adam. Christ comes to restore the image which He made in the beginning.
